

2019 Fairfield County Profile on Substance Use-Related Indicators

Fairfield's three (3) Determinants of Substance Use from best (1) to worst (46):

- with a <u>Social</u> ranking of 21st in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of *Child Maltreatment* (2nd), *Single-Parent Home* (43rd), *Social Associations* (11th), and *Crime Index* (35th);
- an <u>Economic</u> ranking of 34th in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of *Income Inequality* (34th), Unemployment Rate(45th), Children in Poverty (29th), and 4-year High School Graduation Rate (2nd); and finally,
- with an <u>Access to Health-Related Resources</u> determinant of substance use ranking of 33rd in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of Uninsured (21st), Food Insecurity (38th), Primary Care Physician Ratio (29th), and Mental Health Provider Ratio (31st) (2019 County-Level Profile on Substance Use Indicators).

Substance Use, Infectious Disease and Treatment Services:

- Alcohol Use ranking of 4th in the state from best (1) to worst (46) with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of *Binge Drinking Among Adults* (1st), *Heavy Use of Alcohol Among Adults* (1st), *Alcohol-Involved Fatal Traffic Crashes* (2nd *Worsened by 14% compared to 2018); and Alcohol-Related Hospitalizations (13th *Worsened by 16% compared to 2018);
- Nicotine Use ranking of 2nd in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of Current Cigarette Use Among Adults (1st), Current Smokeless Use Among Adults (1st), FDA Compliance Check Inspections of Tobacco Retailers Failed (1st *Improved by 100% compared to 2018) and Abuse/Dependence-Related Inpatient and Emergency Hospitalization (13th *Worsened by .7% compared to 2018);
- Opioids Use ranking of 23rd in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of EMS Naloxone Administrations (46th *Worsened by 30% compared to 2018), Opioid Prescriptions Dispensed (24th *Improved by 10% compared to 2018), Opioid Overdose Deaths (1st *Improved by 100% compared to 2018) and Abuse/Dependence-Related Inpatient and Emergency Hospitalization (14th *Improved by 7% compared to 2018);
- Infectious Disease (New Cases) ranking of 36th in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of HIV (39th), Hepatitis C (39th *Worsened by 23% compared to 2018), Chlamydia (22nd *Improved by 11% compared to 2018) and Gonorrhea (23rd *Worsened by7% compared to 2018); and
- Treatment Services (Number of People Treated in State Funded centers) ranking of 7th in the state with an average ranking of the four (4) identified indicators of Alcohol (3rd *Decrease by 11% compared to 2018), Nicotine (24th *Decrease by 8% compared to 2018), Marijuana (5th *Decrease by 4% compared to 2018) and Opiates (4th *Increased by 27% compared to 2018).
