WHAT ARE OPIOIDS?


Opioids are highly addictive narcotic substances commonly prescribed to treat pain. Opioids are a class of drugs that include licit prescription pain relievers (like vicodin, oxycodone, and fentanyl) and the illicit drug heroin. Taking a prescription opioid medication in a way that is different from what the doctor prescribed is often referred to as prescription drug misuse or abuse.




4 out of 5 heroin users started with Rx pain pills.


1 in 4 people who are prescribed opioids struggle with addiction. Opioid dependency can develop in just 3 days.

WHAT HAVE WE BEEN DOING?

- Installed **1** *new* prescription drop box at Hawthorne Pharmacy for residents to safely dispose of their unused prescription medications.
- Hosted 6 Drug Take Back Days to collect prescriptions and educate the community about the importance of safe disposal.
- Collected **146 lbs** of unused prescription medications.
- Distributed **543** prescription drug deactivation bags (Deterra Bags) to aid in safe disposal of prescription medications.
- Disseminated literature to **2072** Fairfield County residents about the dangers of opioids and stimulants.
- Trained and supplied Narcan to 142 residents to help prevent further overdoses.

- Participate in **Opioid Education and Narcan Distribution** training TODAY through Fairfield Behavioral Health Services (and receive **free NARCAN** to prevent an overdose).
- Administer NARCAN for someone you believe in good faith is experiencing an opioid overdose without being subject to civil or criminal liability.
- Participate in the Strengthening Families Program and Life Skills Program through Fairfield Behavioral Health Services.
- Start treatment and recovery for opioid and stimulant use TODAY at Fairfield Behavioral Health Services.
